




NETWORK CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

Network Centre For Carradale Community Trust By Elder and Cannon Architects



There are four significant existing buildings on the site. Two are currently in use, the cafe and Old Schoolhouse gallery shop. The other two once held the heritage centre, but have shut due to flood damage.

We propose demolishing all but the Old Schoolhouse gallery shop which has been renovated and is in use, and the shell of the old saw mill building with adjoined *snake pit*.

While the collection of buildings is significant to the village and the feeling of the site, the cafe and blue timber-shingled building hold little architectural value. They may also take a lot of work to retrofit to meet contemporary needs. Clearing some of the site will allow the community to develop the site to its best form, to give the maximum value and return on this public asset.


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PROPOSAL A

Proposal A follows the form of the existing buildings and extends the footprint further into the site and woodland.

This proposal retains are wall of buildings to the east while opening up the cafe with large windows and covered outdoor seating. This will engage the public space and open up the area behind the cafe that is currently underused. 

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
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PROPOSAL B


Proposal B follows the footprint of the historic saw mill. This enlarges the public space and adds more formal interest to the east buildings. The gable of the bunkhouse onto the public square evokes images of agricultural buildings. Cafe (56m²) Museum (84m²) Bunk House (50m²) Gallery Shop (24m²) Office / Service (21m²) Covered Outdoor Seating Public Space

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



PROPOSAL C

Proposal C creates a more formal courtyard with the bunkhouse to the north and by rotating the cafe onto the axis of the museum.

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
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


PROPOSAL D

Proposal D puts the bunkhouse above the cafe, freeing up more space in the narrow valley for outdoor public space or future development.
