- 1. Apology Jean Campbell
- 2. The Minutes of the A G M held on 19 June 2019 had been circulated. The Chair invited a vote by poll and the Minutes were approved unanimously.
- 3. Chair's Report.

The Chair presented his report on the past year's activities which had been circulated by email and concluded by thanking all trustees for their various contributions throughout the year but he singled out Malcolm Trott and Jenn Lee for their sterling efforts. 4. Annual Accounts

The Chair also gave a brief report on our efforts to purchase Paterson's Bakery and an update on the possible purchase of Semple's Shop in respect of which a small sub-group was meeting regularly to discuss arrangements in the event of this new venture going ahead. Further information would be available for next year's A G M.

There was a brief discussion on the likelihood of the requirement for a new constitution to reflect developments since the adoption of the

present constitution and the need for amendments believed to be not only desirable but necessary.
